



## Standards for enhancing meaningful engagement of youth in evaluation

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Concept note

### 1. What is this about?

Enhancing meaningful youth engagement in evaluation is critical for equity and social justice in response to COVID-19 and climate crises, and to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals. With this idea, the [Youth in Evaluation celebrations](#) on 23 May 2022 marked the launch of a manifesto ([read](#)) on meaningful engagement of youth and young evaluators in evaluation. In a month since its launch, the manifesto has been adopted by about 80 organizations and 270 individuals, including international development organizations, governments, VOPEs, academia, youth organizations, private sector and NGOs. By adopting the manifesto, the organizations and individuals commit to undertake strategic and concerted efforts to build capacities of young and emerging evaluators and engage youth and young evaluators meaningfully in all stages of evaluation.

### 2. Why do we need standards on youth in engagement in evaluation?

For real change, the commitments in the manifesto needed to be translated into practice. To support this, the standards serve as a tool for promoting self-accountability and improving practice for enhancing meaningful engagement of youth in evaluation.

### 3. What will the standards contain?

The standards will be organized around six dimensions: (1) leadership and accountability; (2) practice; (3) advocacy and capacity development; (4) knowledge management and communications; (5) human resources; and (6) financial resources. Each dimension will include three to five performance indicators to determine the extent of the progress made.

Tailored and specific standards will be developed for each typology of stakeholder groups such as (1) international development organizations, (2) VOPEs, (3) governments, (4) youth organizations, (5) academia, and (6) NGOs/private sector. See Annex 1 as an example of (draft) proposed standards for international development organizations.

#### **4. Who should be involved?**

Intergenerational and participatory consultations will co-create and roll out specific standards for each stakeholder group. This is critical for wide ownership and implementation of the standards. The consultations would also serve as an advocacy mechanism and networking platform with each stakeholder group.

For each standard, a task force will be established following self-nomination. This will include youth representatives, representatives from the stakeholder group and Eval4Action partners/manifesto adoptees/regional communication hub members. In cooperation with Eval4Action, the task force will be responsible for organizing and leading the stakeholder consultation, finalizing the standards and coordinating with other task forces (as needed). Together the task forces will support the launch of the standards in early 2023. The task force members are expected to devote around 1-2 hours per week initially and 2-3 hours per month once standards are finalized. The Eval4Action global team will undertake the overall coordination of the initiative.

Responsibilities of the task force includes:

1. Finalize the concept note for the development of the standards
2. Organize consultations to engage key actors from the stakeholder group for development of the standards
3. Finalize the standards considering inputs from the consultation and the task force members
4. Create awareness among the stakeholder group on the standards
5. Create a plan for the coordinated launch of the standards and support the launch
6. Develop a mechanism to follow up on the uptake of the standards with the stakeholders (focus on self-monitoring and reporting)
7. Review the progress in a timely manner and feature good practices
8. Review the standards for necessary updates

## **5. Timeline**

The timeline includes the following key milestones (but not limited to them):

- Call for self-nominations for the 6 task forces – 30 July 2022
- Finalization of task forces - 15 Aug 2022
- Finalization of the concept note – 31 Aug 2022
- Task force organizes consultations for development of standards – September – November 2022
- Finalization of standards – 15 December 2022
- Awareness raising and launch of the standards – February 2023
- Monitor standards – February 2023 onwards

## Annex 1: (DRAFT) Standards for international development organizations to meaningfully engage youth and young and emerging evaluators in evaluation

1. **LEADERSHIP AND ACCOUNTABILITY:** Leadership in the organization is committed to youth in evaluation
